### *Trafficking Training Back by Demand*

Tuesday, September 30, 2008 2:00-3:00 pm EST

Helga West, President & CEO of Witness Justice, will be presenting her training session on "The Effects of Trauma on Trafficking Victims and Challenges to Healing and Recovery." This session was featured in August and is back by popular demand. The session provides an understanding of the nature and impact of trauma, an understanding of the trauma experienced by trafficking victims, and the barriers to accessing support and challenges to victim recovery. For service providers, emphasis on creating a trauma-informed care environment is highlighted.

Department of Health and Human Services' National Center for Trauma Informed Care. Through Witness Justice, West provides trauma training to government agencies, service providers, and others across the country.

This session is designed to focus on the benefits of journaling as a form of healing arts. The training will encompass methods to help become more self aware through personal reflection and documentation. Ms. Muhammad has recently published a book, [A Survivor's Journal](#), and will showcase the unique journaling method she has developed for survivors of trauma. The benefits of journaling and how it can aid in mental wellness and recovery will also be discussed.

***Trauma Specialist David Washington Presents with Colleagues on Substance Abuse***

Tuesday, November 18, 2008 1:30-2:30 pm EST

David Washington, LGSW, LCADC, AD/PC Sup, a licensed social worker who specializes in the treatment of trauma and chemical dependence, is the program coordinator for both the Jail Substance Abuse and T.A.M.A.R. (Trauma, Addictions, Mental Health, and Recovery) Programs for the Washington County, Maryland, Health Department.





Mr. Washington and two of his colleagues; Kimberly Schroth-Meyer LCWS-C, Program Coordinator and Katie O'Neil, LCSW-C, Mental Health Therapist, will be presenting a training session on "Identifying the Needs and Interventions for Substance Abusing Individuals with a History of Overwhelming Experiences." This training will define trauma, focus on ways to screen for trauma, and explore appropriate ways for service providers working with trauma survivors to intervene when overwhelming situations have the potential to trigger substance abuse.

The State of Maryland was awarded the Healing Ourselves through Promises of Empowerment (H.O.P.E.) Award's State Commendation for its statewide effort - spear-headed by Maryland's Mental Hygiene Administration and Office of Special Needs Populations - to implement the T.A.M.A.R. Program in eight detention centers and one state hospital and to continue its funding through Fiscal Year 2009. Mr. Washington accepted the award on behalf of his colleagues at [Dare to Transform](#), a summit hosted earlier this summer by the Center for Mental Health Services' National Center for Trauma-Informed Care.
